HCA members Martha Smith, Jeff Mercant, Joe Hale, myself; Meg Rose and Sharon Johnson from MANA (Medlock Area Neighborhood Association), County Commissioner Gale Walldorff, Dan Magee, a citizen advisor from Parks & Recreation, and Brad Gilbert from DHYAA (Druid Hills Youth Athletic Association) baseball league all gathered in the second floor meeting room of the park's concession stand to discuss future possibilities for Medlock Park. This first meeting was for preliminary discussions between all the users of the park to come to an understanding on future needs.

CHCA and MANA would like to have more areas in the park open for community use since it does not have welcoming appeal to a wide variety of users other than baseball players. Many children from our area do enjoy playing baseball there, but many others feel fenced out of the park. Areas used most often by neighborhood residents, the playground and pool, are in need of the most help. Marvin Billups of the Parks & Recreation has assured CHCA that a shade structure will be put up at the pool by its opening and benches at the playground will be repaired.

Commissioner Waldorff suggested creating a task force including CHCA, MANA, DHYAA, the YMCA baseball summer league, and Parks & Recreation. The task force will meet May 13th, 7pm at the park's concession stand meeting room.



SPCNP Wins Award

he South Peachtree Creek Nature Preserve (SPCNP) was presented with the Woolford B. Baker Green Space Award by Friends of Emory Forest during a March 17 ceremony at Emory University. In accepting the award, SPCNP President Dave Butler announced that the property's name will be changed to the Clyde Shepherd Nature Preserve.

"We are changing the name of the preserve in honor of Mr. Shepherd's lifelong efforts in DeKalb County and his generosity in letting us use the land," said Butler. The preserve is a 28-acre property in the Medlock Park neighborhood owned by the Shepherd family but leased to the County. The site opened in 1995 under the management of South Peachtree Creek Nature Preserves Inc., a neighborhood organization seeking to conserve natural spaces in the South Peachtree Creek watershed.

The Baker Green Space Award is presented annually by Friends of Emory Forest to an individual or organization that excels in the protection, conservation or enhancement of the natural environment within Emory University or in the community. Efforts awarded include tree plantings, green space creation, reforestation and visionary political leadership. Past recipients include DeKalb County CEO Vernon Jones for his support of green space acquisition, and Gene and Chester Morse, who donated their seven-acre property in Decatur for preservation as green space. The Baker Award is named for the former Emory professor of biology who did so much to create a beautiful environment for the university community.

PATH Update

s many of you saw at our meeting on the Emory campus, the PATH Foundation in conjunction with DeKalb Parks & Recreation, has developed a plan for putting a walking/biking trail in/near our neighborhood. As of that meeting, the trail went from the bridge on Willivee Drive along South Peachtree Creek towards the railroad tracks and then doubled back under the railroad tracks and headed into Mason Mill Park. At a community meeting about improvements to Medlock Park last week. Commissioner Gale Walldorff unveiled an updated version of that map that included a spur from the old Decatur Waterworks that crossed South Peachtree Creek, traversed the Ira Melton Park and came out on Desmond Drive, across from Park Lane. This means our residents will be able to walk/cycle/ skate/three-legged-hop to the library and other facilities in Mason Mill Park without ever venturing onto Clairmont Road !!! Hooray !!! We hope to have a copy of this updated map available for the Spring Block Party on May 22.

CHCA has been in communication with PATH and the County about this project for several years. Work could begin as early as August.
